Michael Alfreds, born in London in 1934, trained as a director at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. He lived in the US from 1954 to 1962, working for **MGM Studios** in Hollywood. Alfreds directed at the Royal National Theatre (1985-1988) He has also directed for Shakespeare's Globe, the **Royal Shakespeare Company**.

Alfreds has authored three books on his methods: Different Every Night (rehearsal processes), Then What Happens (adaptations), and What Actors Do (philosophy). His career spans directing and teaching acting and directing, with a method inspired by **Constantin Stanislavski** and **Rudolf Laban**,

emphasising physical work, text analysis, spontaneity, and interaction in minimalistic productions.
