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CAREER OF THE MONTH

THE CAREER OF THE MONTH IN THIS ISSUE HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO US BY OUR YEAR 9 STUDENT NICK MCDOUGALL AND THEY ARE BRINGING LIGHT TO THEIR OWN PERSONAL PASSION OF LIGHTING DESIGN.

A lighting designer is somebody who will set up and operate the lights for a show, play, concert, or various other aspects of TV production. They will plan where to run and point the lights at the right location as well as run tests on each item the production will be using to make sure it works as intended and produces the quality that the production expects. Programming and operating manual and computer-controlled lighting systems is also a large part of their job, since they must know what button manages which electrical aspect regarding the lighting.



FISHER

A famous lighting designer example could be Jules Fisher. He is an American lighting designer and producer, credited with lighting designs for 300+ productions over the course of his 50 year career of Broadway and off-Broadway work, extensive work in film, ballet, opera, television, and rock and roll concert tours. He won a lifetime award for design in 2022, twenty five Tony nominations (twenty four for Best Lighting Designer and one as co-producer Best Musical nominee "Dancin". He's also won nine Tony awards for lighting design, which is the best record in his category.

The job itself typically consists of changing light positions, practicing how bright you want the lights to be, timing when the lights come in, what colour they will be et cetera. Some of the skills you will need are technical knowledge, the ability to work well under pressure, creative ability, good focus, time management as well as attention to detail. Drama is a preferable subject to take for a GCSE if you're interested in this type of job as you get to view different genres of plays, design where you think lights could fit best as well as getting to know the cues in plays. Beginning small studies for the job becomes applicable at an early age.
