Famous for:

Margo Jones, nicknamed the "Texas Tornado", was an American stage director and producer, best known for launching the American regional theatre movement and for introducing the theatre-in-the-round concept in Dallas, Texas. Margo Jones is often credited with coining the term "Theatre of the Imagination." She believed in creating productions that engaged the audience's imagination and emphasized the importance of intimate, immersive experiences in theatre.

SHIRLEY MACLAINE

Shirley MacLaine is indeed a fascinating figure in the entertainment industry, known for her versatility as an actress, dancer, and singer. Born Shirley MacLean Beaty on April 24, 1934, in Richmond, Virginia, she began her career as a Broadway understudy before transitioning into a successful film career.

During a production of 'The Pajama Game' the main actress Carol Haney broke her ankle just before a production. As her understudy Shirley stepped in and this was a life-changing moment in her early career. MacLaine's impromptu performance garnered attention and ultimately led to her being discovered by film producer Hal B. Wallis. This marked the beginning of her journey into Hollywood.

Throughout her career, MacLaine appeared in a diverse range of films, showcasing her talent across various genres. Some of her notable roles include: 'Around the World in 80 Days (1956)', 'Me and Juliet' (1953), The Trouble with Harry (1955) directed by the one and only Alfred Hitchcock, and also 'Some Came Running' (1958)

In addition to these films, MacLaine's career includes numerous other notable performances in both movies and television. She received critical acclaim and several awards throughout her career, including an Academy Award for Best Actress for her role in **'Terms of Endearment' (1983)**. Overall, Shirley MacLaine's career is a testament to her talent, versatility, and resilience in the entertainment industry. From her humble beginnings as a Broadway understudy to her iconic performances on the big screen, she has left an indelible mark on Hollywood history.
