Famous for:

Antoine Marie Joseph Paul Artaud, better known as Antonin Artaud, was a French artist who is widely recognised as a major figure of the European avant-garde. He worked across a variety of media, but is best known for his writings, as well as his work in the theatre and cinema. He is best known for his theatre style **'Theatre of Cruelty!'** SPOOKY!

Main Dramatic Theory:

Absurdism

- Abolish the stereotypical 'Stage'
- No Props, staging or masks
- Physicality over dialogue
- Attack all the senses of the audience







"Sweeney Todd" is a dark musical about a vengeful barber in Victorian London who seeks revenge on those who wronged him, with the help of his accomplice. Mrs. Lovett, who turns their victims into meat pies. The School District of Janesville in America put on this fantastic show in 2018 and the live recording of it is such of a high professional standard we felt we couldn't NOT share it! With a full orchestra and stunning cast - this one is definitely worth a watch!

KATIE MITCHELL

Katie Mitchell boasts a distinguished career spanning three decades, during which she has helmed over a hundred productions across various genres including mainstream text-based theatre, opera, and innovative live cinema productions, which blend video and theatrical techniques in a distinctive manner. Her artistic endeavors have left a significant mark on prestigious institutions, having directed notable productions for the Royal Shakespeare Company, the National Theatre, and The Royal Court, where she has served as an Associate Director.

THEATRE DIRECTO

Throughout her career, Mitchell has been the recipient of numerous accolades, both in the UK and internationally, recognising her outstanding contributions to the arts. Notable awards include The Evening Standard Best Director Award (1996), multiple Theatertreffen prizes in Germany, a prestigious Obie Award in the United States, and multiple Golden Mask Awards in Russia, among others. Her dedication to nurturing female talent and her groundbreaking representations of womanhood have also been acknowledged with awards such as the Tonic Award in 2018.

In addition to her directorial achievements, Mitchell is also an esteemed educator, holding a professorship in Theatre Directing at Royal Holloway University, where she imparts her knowledge and expertise to aspiring directors on the MA directing course. Furthermore, she serves as a Visiting Professor at Columbia University, further solidifying her influence and commitment to the advancement of theater both in practice and academia.
