A theatre manager is responsible for the front of house team and is usually a permanent employee of a theatre building. They ensure the smooth running of a performance by looking after the audience.



CHANTELLE NOLAN

CHANTELLE NOLAN IS A LIVERPOOL LASS WHO IS THE THEATRE MANAGER FOR ST HELENS THEATRE ROYAL. HERSELF AND HER MUM OWN THE COMPANY REGAL ENTERTAINMENTS LTD WHO RECENTLY TOOK OWNERSHIP OF LIVERPOOL EPSTEIN THEATRE, HOPEFULLY SECURING A BRIGHT FUTURE FOR THE THEATRE THAT WAS GREATLY IMPACTED DURING THE PANDEMIC.

Chantelle also directs and produces St Helens' three annual pantomimes. Regal Entertainments Ltd will now produce three in-house pantomimes a year at The Epstein Theatre. Speaking to the Liverpool Echo Jane said, "This is a very special moment for me. I produced my first ever pantomime, Aladdin, at the then Neptune in 1994. I'm

incredibly excited that 25 years later, to be coming full circle and returning to the theatre where it all started for me – this time as part of the team running the venue. The Epstein is a theatrical jewel and I'm looking forward to helping it continue to sparkle.". As a Theatre Manager you are responsible just like Chantelle for how the theatre is ran. As a theatre manager, you'll have a diverse role that oversees the smooth operational running of the theatre. Tasks can range from coordinating the programme calendar and attracting donations to increasing the theatre's visibility in the community and managing its budget. That is just what Chantelle has done. Chantelle has made the arts accessible for the whole of the Merseyside by introducing the concept of 'Pay What You Can' which allowed members of the community to come and watch theatre without the big price points. The theatre says it's a gesture of goodwill for those in need at a time of crisis, and a chance to give something back to the town and community it's become very much a part of. Panto – and theatre – director Chantelle Nolan says: "A number of theatres, not many, across the country are doing this and I thought it was a really nice idea. "It's a way we can give something back." She goes on: "We want it to be for people who would love to come to see the panto, and who normally come to see the panto, but because of the cost of living crisis genuinely can't afford it. "I think everybody deserves a bit of panto magic "I've already had a lady on from Wavertree who always brings her family but this year

couldn't afford to and she says it's made her day – and the comments on social media already have been really positive, saying what a lovely idea it is and how great to give back." Chantelle adds: "I was a little worried that people might ask why they had paid money to see it and now others get to go for little – or nothing – but this is help for those who genuinely need it and people appreciate that."

It's innovation by the Theatre Manager shown at Theatre Royal St Helens which has secured its reputation as an incredible theatre venue, loved by the masses.
